

# **Year in Review**

Several highlights of the year listed below illustrate not only the need for our services, but also the great support we receive from our community. Due to generous donations, loyal customers and the giving of time and treasures, The Caring Place continues to meet the needs of this dynamic community. This support allowed us to assist 6,947 neighbors in need in 2017.

#### In 2017:

- Second Helping, our second thrift store location, opened in May at 3700 Williams Drive. The offerings of this shop focus on antiques, collectibles, jewelry, décor and unique items.
- Programs & Services moved to a remodeled space at 2001 Railroad Avenue, allowing for more privacy and a welcoming environment for our clients.
- We were voted the best place to Volunteer/Give in Georgetown for the 7<sup>th</sup> year in a row. We also received the Central Texas Food Bank (CTFB) Platinum Designation which reduces the cost of our purchases from CTFB.
- Our Food Pantry broke the record again for the most people served in a single month with over 2,500 neighbors receiving food in November.
- We served 971 new families and 2,446 new individuals in 2017.
- ▼ The Hunger Free Holidays Food Drive exceeded its goal and collected over 208,000 pounds of food for the Food Pantry in a 3 month period!



# The Important Role of Our Volunteers

In 2017, 467 committed volunteers gave a total of 80,812 hours of service to The Caring Place. To illustrate the importance of volunteers, this is equivalent to 39 full-time employees, valued at \$1,950,802. Community service volunteers also provided a total of 7,965 hours which is equivalent to an additional 4 employees. In addition, groups from various schools, churches, organizations and businesses in Williamson County donated their time and talent to help The Caring Place.

Our volunteers Peter Evans, Mike McCarthy and Linda Nix were honored with The Caring Heart Award for excellence. Connie Danaher, Ruffie London and Brenda Tyrrell were awarded the Doris Krohmer Memorial Volunteer Service Award for extraordinary service and dedication to our mission.

Volunteer recruitment continues to be a high priority in 2018. We have positions created by the growing number of people we serve and the additional thrift shop that opened. It's exciting and heartwarming to volunteer in a place where you can learn and make positive contributions to your community with your time. # A Closer Look at Our Food Programs

During 2017, The Caring Place distributed **1,080,388 pounds** of food to area families through four food programs. Utilizing the conversion formula provided by the Central Texas Food Bank (CTFB) in Austin of 1.2 pounds of food equaling one meal, The Caring Place provided 900,323 meals to area families in 2017.

**THE FOOD PANTRY:** Individuals and families may receive a 10-day food supply once a month.

#### **OUR DAILY BREAD:**

Day-old bread and pastries are donated daily from H-E-B and delivered by our dedicated volunteers.

#### **FRESH FOOD FOR FAMILIES:**

Through our partnership with CTFB, fresh fruits and vegetables are provided to The Caring Place for distribution to area families on the 1st, 3rd and 5th Mondays of the month.



**HOPE** (*Healthy Options Program for the Elderly*): In partnership with CTFB, this program assists low income individuals age 55 and over with supplemental food once a month.

# **Where Our Funding Comes From**

In 2017, **\$1,754,605** of our funding came from the sale of donated, gently used and new items in our thrift stores, which equals 68% of our total revenues received. The revenue generated from our thrift stores, *The Shops at The Caring Place* and **Second Helping** covers all of the

operating costs of the organization. This ensures that 100% of all financial donations to The Caring Place go directly to help area families in need.
